Thank you to all who supported the NTRA's Legislative Action Campaign fundraising activities last year through the sales Check-off Program and direct contributions. Buyers, sellers, consignors, sale companies, farm owners, and horseplayers drove a 10% increase in contributions over 2024. The full contributor list begins on page 5.

One of the NTRA's key successes on Capitol Hill in 2025 was reinstatement of 100% bonus depreciation for qualified asset purchases, including Thoroughbred bloodstock, through the One Big Beautiful Bill Act that was signed into law on July 4, 2025. Record yearling sales soon followed at Fasig-Tipton in August and at Keeneland in September, with momentum continuing into the 2026 two-year-old in training sales season.

Another NTRA success story in Washington, DC is the NTRA's annual Kentucky Derby Kickoff Reception on Capitol Hill. In April 2026, the NTRA once again hosted hundreds of Congressional staffers, members of Congress and other friends of Thoroughbred racing in the Cannon House Office Building. During the reception, NTRA President and CEO Tom Rooney presented Senator Mitch McConnell (R-KY) with the inaugural Statesman of the Year Award, honoring his four decades of service to improve the Thoroughbred industry.

Your continued financial support ensures Thoroughbred racing is well represented on Capitol Hill.

## **Tom Rooney** | Horse PAC<sup>®</sup> President | NTRA President and CEO

Tom Rooney served the people of Florida in the U.S. House of Representatives from 2009 to 2019, focusing primarily on economic, agricultural, national security, and military issues. Prior to serving in Congress, Rooney served with the U.S. Army as a lawyer in the JAG Corps. During his tenure, he was Special Assistant U.S. Attorney at Fort Hood, Texas, prosecuting all civilian crimes on post in the 1st Cavalry Division. After completing active duty with the rank of captain, Rooney taught constitutional and criminal law at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, New York.

He received his J.D. from the University of Miami School of Law and became a member of the Florida Bar in 1999. He also has an M.A. in Political Science from the University of Florida. Rooney played football for Syracuse University and Washington & Jefferson College, where he earned a B.A. in English Literature. Rooney is married to his wife, Tara, and they have three sons.

## **Joe Bacigalupo**

Joe Bacigalupo is Sr. Vice President of External Affairs for the NTRA. Bacigalupo is based in the NTRA's Lexington, Ky. office and heads the organization's development efforts that support the NTRA's federal legislative advocacy work.

Bacigalupo served as marketing manager for Churchill Downs, Inc., before joining NTRA. In his role with CDI, Bacigalupo created and executed both short term and long-range marketing plans and programs to ensure the profit, growth and expansion of the pari-mutuel wagering product from CDI's family of Thoroughbred racetracks. Bacigalupo began his career in the horse racing industry at TVG Network, now known as FanDuel TV, where he served as field marketing manager when the fledgling television network and advance deposit wagering company launched across the United States. Prior to entering the horse racing industry, Bacigalupo worked for Georgia-Pacific Corp.

# 2025 LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY AND UPDATE

As the representative organization for the Thoroughbred industry, the NTRA directs its lobbying efforts toward legislation that significantly impacts its members and their business engagements in the realms of horse racing, breeding, and pari-mutuel wagering. Additionally, the NTRA advocates for Congressional education initiatives addressing broader issues like agriculture and immigration, which have implications for the entire horse industry. The following outlines key legislative matters pertinent to Thoroughbred breeding and racing during the 118<sup>th</sup> and 119<sup>th</sup> Congresses.

**Upcoming Elections.** While it was only two years ago that Donald Trump and the Republicans secured the legislative trifecta, it now feels like they'd be happy to keep any majority in the House or Senate. The midterms are coming shortly, with Democrats currently projected to take the House, and make the Senate a toss-up.

The NTRA continues to be well-positioned no matter who is in charge of the gavel, as we continue to expand our relationship with leaders and important lawmakers on both sides of the aisle.

## TAX BILL AND BONUS DEPRECIATION.

Speaker of the House Mike Johnson (R-LA) and House Republicans passed the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" (218 - 214). It was then sent to the President's desk, where it was signed into law on July 4. The most noteworthy part of the tax bill regarding the Thoroughbred racing industry is the inclusion of permanent 100% bonus depreciation. We also got a separate provision amended so that it wouldn't eliminate the benefits of bonus depreciation for small businesses, including horse owners. Also notable is the change in deduction regarding gambling losses - from 100% to 90%.

100% bonus depreciation being made law permanently is a win that's hard to overstate. It's something the industry has been fighting for for a long time. That's why removing the provision that would have eliminated the benefits, located in Section 461(l), was equally as important. After a few months, the first reviews started to roll in, in the form of late summer and fall sales numbers. There has been a steady tide of record-breaking sales numbers for the past few months, indicating more of a pattern rather than an aberration.

While the gambling tax deduction changes were disappointing, there is already a bipartisan effort underway to remedy the situation. Rep. Dina Titus (D-NV) has introduced the FAIR BET Act, while Rep. Andy Barr (R-KY) has introduced the WAGER Act. Both bills would return the deduction back to 100 percent.

## SUPREME COURT OVERTURNS TRUMP TARIFFS.

The Supreme Court struck down President Trump's global tariffs earlier this year, in a 6-3 vote. The court said the President exceeded his power to invoke the federal emergency-powers law to impose the worldwide tariffs he announced last April.

This doesn't mean tariffs are going away, however. The Trade Act of 1974 allows the President to impose tariffs for up to 150 days, at which point Congress would have to vote to extend them. This date would be sometime in July. The day the Supreme Court made its decision, the President also announced a new worldwide tariff rate of 10%, using the Trade Act to do so. Over the weekend of the announcement, Trump said he would increase this number to 15%, but this hasn't yet happened officially.

What this means in the short term is that tariff rates go up or down depending on which country you are importing from. It also means that many countries and coalitions like the European Union (EU) are putting their trade deal negotiations on hold until more is revealed. The United States and the EU were deep in negotiations for a trade deal before the Supreme Court made its announcement.

What this doesn't change is the various exceptions for horses. Horses coming in from Canada and Mexico are still duty-exempt goods through the U.S.-Mexico-Canada (USMCA) trade agreement. Horses coming in for racing or other temporary events can get a temporary import bond or carnet.

This is a developing situation, and more tariffs could be added in the future.

## SPORTS BETTING AND PREDICTION MARKETS.

Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) Chairman Michael Selig announced in a video on X that the agency has filed a "friend of the court" brief in support of Crypto.com regarding its legal battle in Nevada.

This is the first time the CFTC has taken a side when it comes to the issue of prediction markets. For those unfamiliar, prediction markets are platforms that allow users to "trade" the outcomes of events, like on the stock market. For example, one could trade on the outcome of the Presidential election and predict who would win.

The thorniest part of prediction markets involves the exact definition. Are they gambling or not? Right now, it hasn't been decided. Courts are intervening across the country, especially now that various prediction markets allow users to trade on sports outcomes.

"Over the past year, American prediction markets have been hit with an onslaught of state-led litigation," Selig said in the video.

"The CFTC will no longer sit idly by while overzealous state governments undermine the agency's exclusive jurisdiction over these markets by seeking to establish statewide prohibitions on these exciting products," said Selig.

Notably, Selig did not mention sports in that video. Utah's Republican Governor, Spencer Cox, replied to the post on X, vowing to fight Selig and the CFTC in court, claiming that prediction markets are gambling and should fall under the already-in-place regulations.

It remains to be seen where this fight will end, especially with Congress not weighing in with a law defining a prediction market. Various legal battles across the country will likely determine what happens, though that could take months.

Regarding Thoroughbred racing in particular, all prediction markets are well aware of the Interstate Horseracing Act (IHA) and are not infringing on it. No contracts were offered on the Kentucky Derby or Preakness stakes. In a letter to the CFTC, NTRA President and CEO Tom Rooney reminded the commission that any wagering on horseracing needs specific consent requirements from the industry. While the industry welcomes a fair agreement being made, that has not happened yet. So, prediction markets are staying out of racing, as per the IHA.

## SAFE ACT ADDED TO TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE BILL.

On May 22, 2026, the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee passed its Surface Reauthorization Package out of committee, sending it to the floor for a vote by the House of Representatives and then, hopefully, the Senate. This bill includes the language of the Save America's Forgotten Equines (SAFE) Act, something that the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) has been working to pass into law for years. The language itself outlaws the transportation of horses across the border for slaughter and consumption purposes. The NTRA will now focus on ensuring this important provision makes its way through the legislative process and becomes law.

## NTRA 1/4% CHECK-OFF PROGRAM

### What is the NTRA 1/4% Check-off Program?

The 1/4% Check-off Program is an NTRA fundraising program that empowers participants at sales hosted by NTRA partners to support the NTRA's federal legislative advocacy services that amplify the horse racing industry's voice in Washington, DC. Buyers and sellers may participate in the Program by pledging \$2.50 for every \$1,000 of a horse's sale price of any or all their horses.

### How do I participate?

For Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton, CTBA and WTBOA sales, sellers, consignors, and designated agents may "pre-commit" their pledge on sales entry forms for the Check-off Program. Sellers who miss the deadline for pre-commitments may pledge until the close of sale billing. Buyers may include their contribution when submitting payment. For OBS sales, the NTRA contacts buyers and sellers directly with suggested contribution information.

### How much can I contribute?

There is no limit on the amount that can be contributed in the Check-off Program. Sale price determines the contribution amount for a particular horse. Individuals who buy or sell multiple horses may contribute on any or all of them.

### How can Federal lobbying help make the horse racing industry more competitive?

We will fight to secure legislation that benefit industry stakeholder groups like horse owners, breeders, racetracks, advance deposit wagering service providers and horseplayers. We will address issues that directly impact racing, such as taxation, internet wagering, immigration, sports betting expansion and matters that affect farmers, ranchers and other agricultural producers.

### How does the NTRA lobby on Capitol Hill?

NTRA fields a government relations team based in Washington, DC, that is led by former U.S. Congressman and current NTRA President and Chief Executive Officer, Tom Rooney. NTRA also coordinates with the American Horse Council on legislative advocacy issues that affect all equine breeds and disciplines.

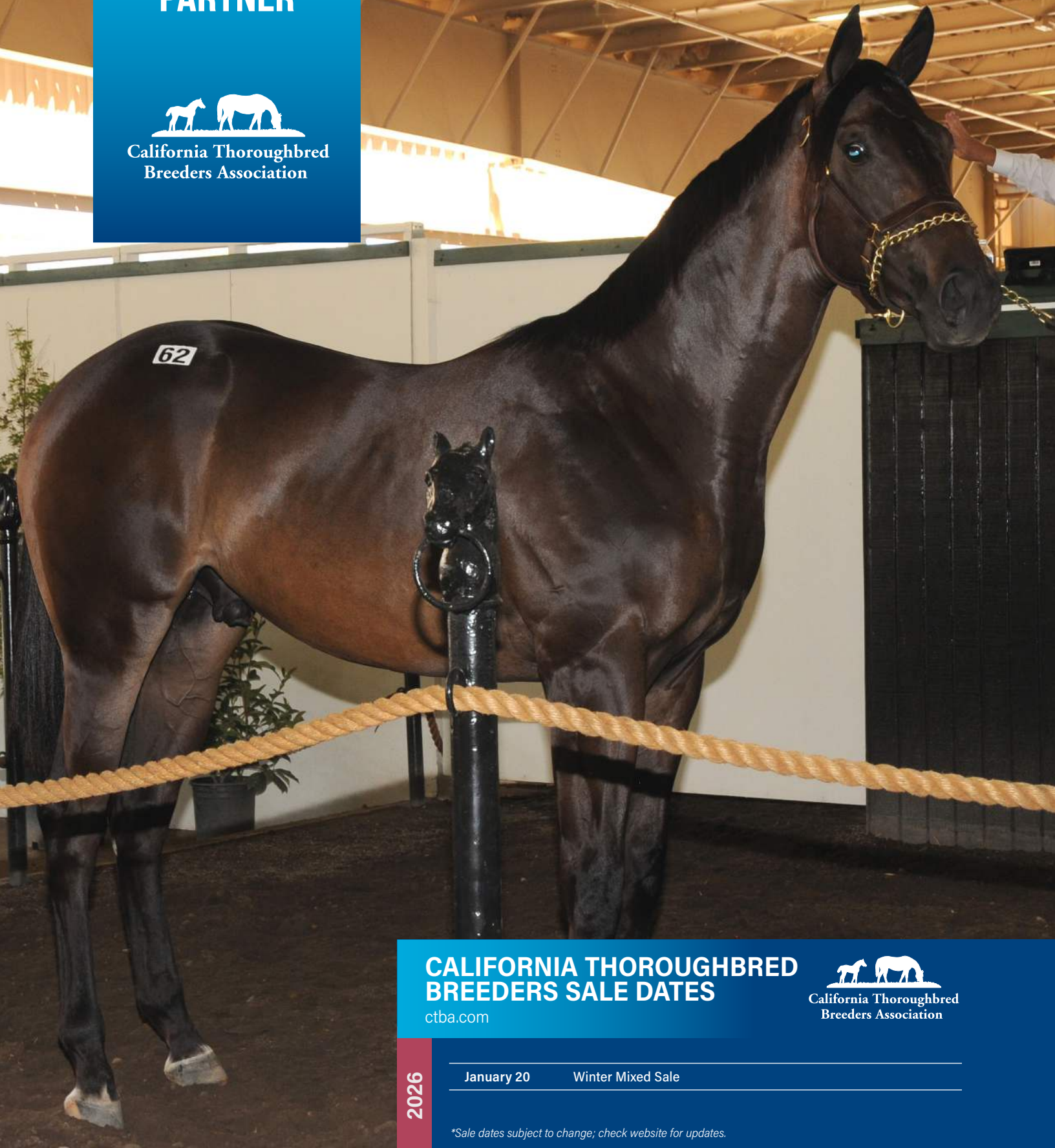

# NTRA'S FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE STRATEGY

The NTRA's government relations team performs a broad array of legislative advocacy services for the horse racing and breeding industry. Working closely with the NTRA membership and Board of Directors, the team determines the industry's governmental priorities and then develops a comprehensive legislative strategy to achieve these priorities. The current strategy includes building relationships with members of Congress and their staffs, educating them about industry issues and concerns and introducing lawmakers and staff to industry members in the field.

The government relations team uses a combination of resources to enhance its presence and effectiveness on Capitol Hill. NTRA President and Chief Executive Officer, Tom Rooney, served as a U.S. Congressman for 10 years and has a strong network of federal legislators and their staffers who assist the team. Anchoring the team's efforts is the formation of an NTRA office on Capitol Hill that opened in June 2022. Additionally, the team is in daily contact with established lobbying firms in Washington, DC, to help move horse racing's legislative agenda through Congressional processes of meeting with Congressional staffers and members of Congress, bill drafting, committee mark-ups, hearings, and votes.

One essential element of maintaining this effective presence in Washington is robust fundraising. The NTRA primarily secures financial support through its Legislative Action Campaign's ¼% Check-off Program at major Thoroughbred auctions. Industry members who buy and sell at Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton, Ocala Breeders' Sales Company (OBS), California Thoroughbred Breeders and Owners Association and the Washington Thoroughbred Breeders & Owners Association may contribute one quarter of one percent of each horse's sale price to help fund the Campaign.

Horseplayers who join the NHC Tour at a certain membership level also contribute to the NTRA's Legislative Action Campaign through their membership.

Campaign finance also is important to NTRA advocacy. The NTRA government relations team organizes and participates in fundraisers on behalf of Horse PAC®, the political action committee of the NTRA. Horse PAC® had disbursed more than \$4.9 million to upwards of 375 federal political candidates and leadership PACs since 2002. [Click here](#) to read the 2025 Horse PAC® Annual Report.

Another component of the NTRA's government advocacy efforts for more than a decade was the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance. Formed in 2008, the Alliance promoted national uniformity through a national Code of Standards and Accreditation process covering six areas: 1) injury reporting and prevention; 2) a safer racing and training environment; 3) uniform medication, testing, and penalties; 4) jockey safety and welfare; 5) aftercare and transition of retired racehorses; and 6) wagering security. The Alliance proved to be helpful in the formation and passing of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA), a federal law that creates uniform standards in two areas: anti-doping and medication control and racetrack safety to protect horses and jockeys. HISA's racetrack safety program went into effect on July 1, 2022, replacing the Alliance. HISA's anti-doping and medication control program began on May 22, 2023.



The horse racing industry is part of a \$37 billion agri-business that supports nearly half a million jobs touching every state. In 2025, more than \$11 billion was wagered on horse racing nationwide. Governmental regulation and oversight are critical to horse racing's economic development and long-term survival. For this reason, the NTRA dedicates significant resources to protecting and promoting horse racing on Capitol Hill.

Starting with a landmark 2000 amendment to the Interstate Horseracing Act that paved the way for online betting on pari-mutuel horse racing, the NTRA has built a significant presence on Capitol Hill. The NTRA strengthened its presence even as federal lobbying expenditures by all industries have skyrocketed. The chart below shows the tremendous growth in lobbying expenditures across all industries, including the gambling sector.

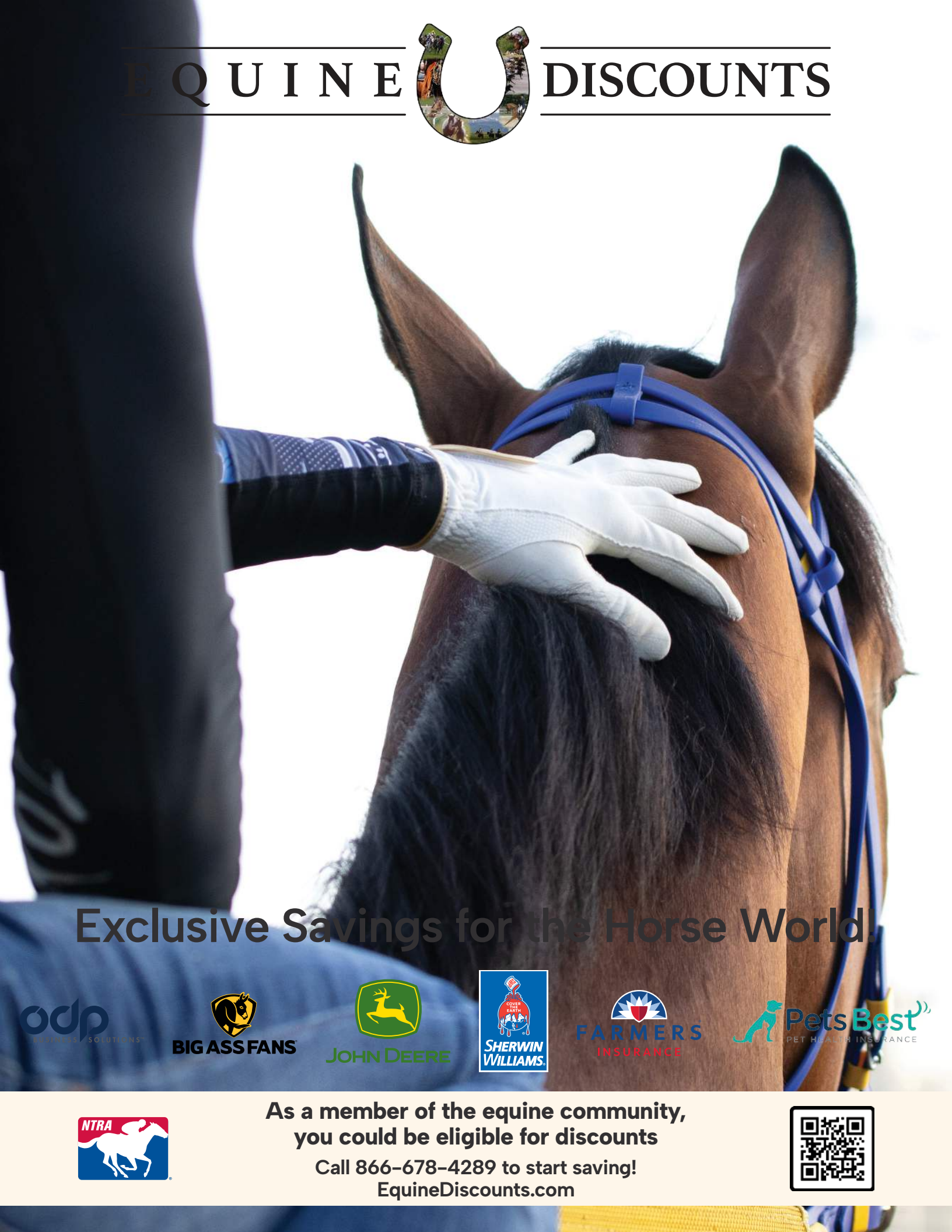
